Travel

There are two railway stations nearby – Cambridge and Cambridge North. Cambridge is the closest station to St Catharine's College, about 1.5 miles away.

There are several [bus services](#) offering routes in and around Cambridge. Stagecoach runs 8 different 'Citi' bus routes around Cambridge. All the Citi bus services go through Cambridge City Centre. The main bus station is on Drummer Street near Christ's Pieces. There is also the [Universal Bus](#) service which has a stop at Cambridge railway station (stop 8), with a stop near St Catharine's College (Pembroke Street).

Alternatively, there is a taxi rank outside the station. It is not necessary to book a taxi as there are usually taxis waiting, but if you would like to the main companies in Cambridge are:

Parking
